The historic home located at 2870 Cherokee Street was built in 1870. The interior has been lovingly decorated to provide a warm and welcoming setting for restaurant goers, shoppers and guests of gatherings such as bridal lunches, baby showers, birthdays, anniversaries, graduations and other celebrations, alike. A player piano



sets a perfect backdrop for morning tea or an elegant lunch. Eventually, Sandra hopes to expand to other areas on the property creating an outdoor dining experience to be enjoyed in the warmer seasons of the year.

CHEROKEE STREET GATEWAY STUDY

In addition to the LCI study, the City of Kennesaw is also currently involved in a Cherokee Street Gateway Study.

This study will simplify the zoning in the Cherokee Stree corridor more clearly defining the guidelines for property owners and developers, alike.

The changes are expected to improve the aesthetics of our city's main gateway from I-75 and improve the safety and efficiency of traffic flow on Cherokee Street.

KENNESAW HOSTS ITS FIRST BEER FEST!



It was several years in the making but well worth the wait! What started as an idea introduced by Mike Serkedakis several years ago, finally came to fruition as the KDDA hosted Kennesaw's first annual Craft Beer Fest on September 27th at Depot Park.

LIVABLE COMMUNITIES INITIATIVE: DOWNTOWN MASTER PLAN UPDATE

Did you know that the City of Kennesaw is involved in an active LCI study?

The definition of an LCI study from the Atlanta Regional Commissions Website: The Livable Centers Initiative (LCI) is a program that awards planning grants on a competitive basis to local governments and nonprofit organizations to prepare and implement plans for the enhancement of existing centers and corridors consistent with regional development policies, and also provides transportation infrastructure funding for projects identified in the LCI plans.

The community vision for this study which was shaped by residents' comments is: Create an active Downtown Kennesaw that serves its multi-generational community with a mix of uses and community amenities, while preserving the small town charm.

Starting in August, members of the public were invited to speak with our study consultants and our city staff and let them know what they would like to see to ensure that the future Kennesaw is the kind of city they'd be proud to call home.

On November 19, we held a celebration to display the results thus far to the public. The intital phases have been very exciting to watch and be a part of. The plan is still a work in progress.

YOUR FRIENDLY MAIN STREET PHARMACY

Main Street Pharmacy at the corner of Main Street and Jiles Road combines the nostalgia of an old-time, neighborhood pharmacy with all the perks of modern day life. Kennesaw is fortunate to have such a unique business in our area and if you haven't visited yet, you owe it to yourself to do so.

As you walk in the door, you'll see the store is full of variety and convenience. At the front is Joe's Coffee Café. Along with a selection of fine coffees, specialty drinks and pastries, there's even a sitting area where you can connect with a friend or business contact in a quiet and friendly environment.

Like any well-stocked pharmacy you can find cold remedies, first aid cream and vitamins, greeting cards, drinks and snacks, but at Main Street Pharmacy, you'll find so much more. The selection includes collegiate items, fan items representing local high school teams, seasonal items, toys and a nice assortment of gifts for any occasion.

For Kennesaw's skateboarders, there's a skateboard counter where Eastern skateboards and components are sold. You can buy decks, trucks or completes...whatever suits your needs. Upon request, there's a tool at the front counter that can be borrowed for making adjustments to your skateboard while in the store.

There's a meeting room that can be used at no-charge by non-profits or for a nominal fee to other businesses and organizations. Having an in-house coffee and pastry bar also makes bringing hospitality to your gathering a breeze.

In the afterhours of the first and third Friday evening each month, the pharmacy transforms into a gathering place for Open Mic Night where local music enthusiasts bring guitars and other instruments and play and sing together. Open Mic Night goes from 6: 30 pm to 8:30 pm.

It is the goal of Main Street pharmacy to offer the kind of small town service that pharmacies were known for before the rise of large chain pharmacies. You can expect fast, friendly and professional service by people who know your name. They'll even deliver your prescription to your home or office for free within a 5 miles radius of the store. Now that's service!

Main Street Pharmacy is open for your convenience Monday through Friday from 9 am to 7 pm and Saturdays from 10 am to 2pm. They are closed on Sunday.
